

PURPLE COMFY DAY: Tomorrow the 26th, we will have a PURPLE COMFY DAY to raise money for the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. STEWARDSHIP MASS: Our next Stewardship Mass is THIS Sunday, January 28 at St. Paul Church at 8:00 a.m. Mass parts have been handed out at school. If your child has been assigned a part, but come Sunday morning, you can't make it, please contact your child's teacher or send a Remind message. Students in grades K-8 are asked to sit together **upstairs in the choir loft.** Any Kindergarten student that would prefer to stay downstairs with their family may do so. PreK students are also encouraged to attend, but we ask that they sit with their families. We would love to see ALL our families represented at Mass, and we look forward to celebrating St. Paul School with our St. Paul Parish family!

RECEPTION: Be sure to stop for coffee, hot cocoa, juice, and donuts at school after Stewardship Mass. Shop the Scholastic Book Fair and check out all the family projects on display! You <u>MUST</u> tell us ahead of time what your plans are. Again, students must have a signed note from a parent if they will be going home with someone else.

S.O.S. DONATIONS: Next Wednesday, we'll be collecting items for Operation S.O.S. in Dwight. This community organization mails out care packages to area soldiers serving across the U.S. and abroad.
