**STEWARDSHIP MASS:** Our next Stewardship Mass is THIS Sunday, January 30 at 8:00 a.m. at St. Paul Church. Mass parts are being handed out at school. If your child has been assigned a part, but come Sunday morning, you can't make it, please contact your child's teacher or send a Remind message. Students in grades K-8 that attend are asked to sit on the left side of the church in the pews behind the organ to make up the choir - only two students per pew. PreK students are also encouraged to attend, but we ask that they sit with their families. This is our **KICK OFF** to <u>Catholic Schools Week</u> so we hope to see MANY of our students and families at Mass!

**CSW:** Please let the office know if you are in need of another Catholic Schools Week schedule. It will be emailed again before next week and is also posted on the school's website. Daily "Reminds" will go out with each day's theme.

**S.O.S. COLLECTION:** On Wednesday of Catholic Schools Week, we will be taking up a collection of items for Operation S.O.S. out of Dwight. The group will be sending care packages for Valentine's Day to nearly 40 military members from the area stationed across the globe! Below is a recommended list of **individually wrapped items** to send in: rice krispies treats, fruit snacks, beef jerky/slim jims, granola bars, gum, non-chocolate candy (so it doesn't melt), cheese/peanut butter crackers, etc.

CALENDAR CHANGES: The superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Peoria has given approval for every diocesan school to schedule a "mental health day" for faculty/staff and students each month for the remainder of the school year. This comes on the heels of a new state law allowing students in public schools to take such days. COVID has brought about significant changes in the educational environment and while we have worked extremely hard to keep our building open and keep things as normal for the students as possible, some days pose challenge on top of challenge...on top of challenge. We will begin utilizing these days next month, so there will be NO SCHOOL on Friday, February 18. This will extend the Presidents' Day weekend. The remaining dates will be sent out once they've been finalized. There is NO homework or remote learning on these days, and they will NOT be made up at the end of the school year. These last few years have really shown us how crucial our mental health is to our overall wellness. We hope our students, as well as faculty and staff, use these days to refresh in body, mind, and spirit.

**SCREENINGS:** A representative from the Livingston County Health Department will be in on Monday, January 31 to perform annual vision and hearing screenings. <u>Vision screenings</u> will be done, as mandated, for the following children: Pre-K, Kindergarten, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grades. In addition, special needs students, teacher referrals, and transfer students during the 2021/2022 school year will also be screened. Vision screenings are not a substitute for a complete eye and vision evaluation by an eye doctor. Your child is not required to undergo this vision screening if an optometrist or ophthalmologist has completed and signed a form indicating that an examination has been administered within the previous 12 months and is on file at the school. Vision screening is not an option. If a vision examination report is not on file at school for your child, your child in the mandated age, grade, or group will be screened. <u>Hearing screenings</u> will be performed on students in Pre-K through 3rd grades.

**THE COVID:** Please continue to be mindful and watch for COVID symptoms in your children and yourself. While we are coming down from the surge we had at school, we must remain vigilant. Many of the recent cases presented with fevers or just like a cold-sore throat, runny nose, headaches, etc. Please keep your children home if they display any of those symptoms and have them tested. From ALL we've heard lately regarding testing, it appears the SHIELD testing (the "spit" test) is the most reliable and produces the quickest result.
